ECONOMIC POLICY COMMITTEE BTPS

The Negotiating Sub-committee has been meeting with the School Board to negotiate our contract for the last two months we have decided to hold a bargaining unit meeting to inform you of the developments and challenges that have occurred in the initial stages of bargaining. Some of the challenges surround the provincial bargaining tactic of ASBA (Alberta School Boards Association) called 'transparency', which has included publishing initial bargaining proposals in other jurisdictions. We don't believe that you should have to defend our proposal in public.

Why should you attend?

At that meeting we will provide a detailed summary of the history of negotiations, discuss future actions, and we will also vote on an authorization for the application of a government appointed mediator. This does not mean we are proceeding to mediation, this only gives the committee the authorization to move this direction if we feel we have reached impasse.
