- 600+ new teachers took part in the Beginning Teachers Conference September
 22 24 in Edmonton. (493 were preregistered by PEC)
- Money is coming from the Department of Education for more School Boards to join the "Inclusion Pilot Program".
- \$34 051.79 has been donated by Locals et al to aid the teachers of Slave Lake.
- The first Practice Review case is on our books. The case centers on the competency of the teacher in the classroom.
- Tripartite discussions will start shortly after the Minister of Education is named.
- Cycle 5 of AISI has been announced. There is a new emphasis on the role of the teacher in planning and guiding the project.
- JC Couture has been selected as the new "Assistant Co-ordinator of Research" and Jonathan Teghtmeyer has been selected as the new "Assistant Co-ordinator of Communications"
- 422 teachers attended Summer Conference this year.
